

Testing will take place March 5 – May 21. District policy states that we have a proctor in each testing room. Proctors for testing can be anyone who is willing to volunteer, and who has been approved through the district to volunteer at Wards Creek Elementary. To sign up to volunteer at Wards Creek Elementary School, you may visit the school's homepage and under "Quick Links" click on "School Access Form." The volunteer application is easy to fill out and is usually approved within two weeks of submission.

Test administrators must NOT administer the assessment(s) to their family members. In addition, under no circumstances may a student's parent/guardian be present in a student's testing room.

Note from our ILC

Hi Warrior Families,

We have spent the last ten newsletters exploring the ten anchor standards in reading! These guiding standards will be important to keep in mind as students progress through their K-12 educational careers. So after a large focus on reading...let's do some math! While each grade level has a specific set of content standards (these standards can be found at http://flstandards.org/), there are also an additional eight standards that also span K-12 education. These standards are known as the *Standards for Mathematical Practice* and are what I like to refer to as "habits of good mathematicians." I will take the next eight newsletters to explore each of these eight standards and give you some suggestions how to encourage your child in mathematics.

Standards for Mathematical Practice' Standard 1: Make sense of problems and persevere in solving them.

This standard has two parts. First, students learn to "making sense of problems." When we think about mathematically proficient students, they are able to explain the meaning of a problem and look for entry points to its solution. Students should independently check their answers using different methods, and continually ask themselves, "Does this make sense?" The second part of this standard encourages students to "preserve in solving problems." To achieve this students need opportunities to engage in productive struggle through problems and not give up! We look for students who monitor and evaluate their progress throughout the problem solving process and change their strategy if necessary. Students who preserve believe in themselves and keep trying beyond their first attempt.

So what can you do? Here are a few suggestions to help your child makes sense of problems and preservers in solving them:

- **Ask questions, don't give answers**: We can often times think we are helping our child when we jump in with an answer, quicker method, or different way. Resist the urge to jump in and rescue your child. Instead ask questions such as: What do you understand about this problem? What are you still wondering? Does that make sense? Is there another way you could solve this? How can you use what you already know to solve what you don't know?
- **Praise your child's effort, not correctness**: In the book <u>Mindset: The New Psychology of Success</u>, author Carol Dweck explains that we should praise children for qualities they can control, like effort. Children praised for their "intelligence" or "innate brainpower" can develop the sense that hard work isn't necessary.
- **Model preserving and taking risks:** Consider expressing your excitement when a problem is challenging. Challenging problems are an opportunity to grow!
- Stay calm, and contact the teacher: Instead of throwing your hands up at the "new math" and telling your child to just do it the way you did, take a deep breath and contact your child's teacher. They are your best resource!

Above all, resist the urge to tell your child "I was never good at math!" Unfortunately this phrase has become acceptable in our society (yet we would scoff at someone who said "I'm not good at reading"). Keeping a positive attitude about math will help your child tremendously!

"Comfort for Canines"





This year our Kindergarten classes at Wards Creek have begun a community service project to help our local animal shelters and we need your help!

How you can help:

Clean out your closet and throw in the towel! The shelters are in need of these items: *Blankets, towels, fleece throws, pet beds, and baby blankets.*

Think soft, absorbent, and not too bulky... things you'd wash at home. Items that can cushion the bottoms of crates and kennels, and keep dogs' noses, paws and ears dry.



Items that are not so good to donate:

For the most part, shelters do not want bed sheets – they are not absorbent enough and do not stand up to repeated laundering.

Anything too bulky is difficult for the shelter staffs to manage; this precludes comforters, bedspreads, heavy area rugs, queen or king-sized quilts and mattress covers.

• No pillows at all.

• No electric blankets, please, unless the cords are removed.

• *No clothes, please!*

Feel free to start sending in these items now. You can either send it in with your child, leave it at the front desk, or walk it in to your child's classroom. Thank you so much for your help and support. Look for an update soon after our first drop off to the shelters!

News from the Art Room:

We were invited to participate in the 450th Compassion through the Eyes of a Child obelisk art project. Each elementary school in St. Johns County has received a 4′ wooden model of the obelisk that stands on the Plaza de la Constitution in St. Augustine, commemorating the Spanish Constitution of 1812. The four tenets of the Constitution were Compassion, Human Rights, Freedom, and Democracy. These tenets align nicely with St. Johns County school district's pillars of Character Counts. The obelisks will be designed and painted by students and displayed around St. John's County throughout the summer. In the fall they will join larger 8ft obelisks, painted by professional artists, for a major art exhibit. The obelisks will finally be returned to each school to be kept as part of the school's permanent collection and as a reminder of the commitment made by our students to the four tenets of Compassionate St. Augustine. 
This summer program is available to all students currently in grades five through eight and has been sponsored by the school district since 1982. All instructors in the program are St. Johns County School District teachers.

Three 8 day sessions are held at Gamble Rogers Middle School School with bus transportation provided. The three sessions are June 8th to June 18th, June 22nd to July 2nd, and July 6th to July 16th. Small classes of 12 – 14 students are separated by grade level.

The Marine Science Program is a carefully designed experience for responsible students who are interested in learning about our local marine environments. Learning is "hands on" in the field. Students access various marine environments while kayaking, canoeing, boating, hiking, biking, snorkeling, surfing, windsurfing, sailing, and SUP's (stand up paddleboards).

If your child is selected for the program, a final application form will be mailed out from the district office in April.

Pinwheel 2nd Annual Parade" March against Child Abuse – April 11th

April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month and since 1989, people nationwide wear the blue ribbon and carry blue pinwheels in April to create awareness of the need to keep kids safe and families strong.

The "2nd Annual Parade" Pinwheel March against Child Abuse will be on April 11th at the SAYS Hutson Family Campus from 10:00-11:30am. There will be a ceremonial "parade" around the campus, free children's activites, parenting information and people on hand to answer questions about resources available in St. Johns County.

"April is a time to celebrate the important role that communities play in protecting children," says Schuyler Siekfer, SAYS Executive Director. "Everyone's participation is critical. Focusing on ways to build and promote the protective factors, in every interaction with children and families, is the best thing our community can do to prevent child maltreatment and promote optimal child development."
