A Note from Our ILC: Christa Ritchie



Last month, I discussed the importance of reading for children at home. This month, I would like to discuss another piece of Literacy that is near my heart- Classroom Libraries. Over the next year, Wards Creek will be dedicating time and money to enhance our classroom libraries. Our hope is that each classroom will have an area that is dedicated to children being surrounded with books. You might wonder why?

- Recent studies on literacy confirm what educators have known for years: the more contact
 children have with books, the better readers they become. Teachers can promote better
 reading performance by reading to children daily and by having them interact with books
 through the extensive use of classroom libraries.
- Fountas and Pinnell (1996) recommend a collection of about 300-600 books, depending on the grade level and number of copies of each title. Their calculations estimate that teachers should expect first-graders to read about 100-125 books during the school year, and older children, who are likely to read longer books, 50-75 books for the year.

Wards Creek Elementary Home Access Center (HAC) Account Registration Instructions



Accessing Home Access Center (HAC) for the first time (applies to new users and existing Parent Assistant (PA) users):

- If you have a current PA account, you can use the same Username and Password to login to HAC. Enter your Username and Password at the new HAC website: http://parents.stjohns.k12.fl.us/hac
- How to get a Home Access Center account (for new users who do not have a Parent Assistant (PA) account):
 - a. Parents/Guardians can then register online:
 - i. http://parents.stjohns.k12.fl.us/hac
 - ii. At the Home Access Center Login screen, click "here" below the statement, "If you do not have a username and password...."
 - iii. At the Home Access Center User Registration:
 - Enter your First name, Last name, City and Zip Code as it appears in eSchoolPlus
 - a. Standard City spellings include: Saint Augustine, East Palatka, Ponte Vedra, Ponte Vedra Beach, Elkton, Jacksonville, Saint Johns, Hastings and Fruit Cove
 - 2. Then click the Register button
 - 3. (next screen) Then create your Username (using your email address)
 - Then create two challenge questions (something detailed only you would know) (Example: What was your first car?)
 - 5. Review and accept the Terms of Use and Privacy Policy
 - 6. Click the Finish button
 - iv. Click the link in your HAC email to create your HAC password
 - A webpage will load with your challenge questions. After you answer your challenge questions, you will then be able to create your password, (please use at least eight characters including a number or special character)
 - vi. You can now login to HAC using your new Username and Password
- 3. If you have forgotten your Password:
 - On the login screen, click the "forgot my username or password" link
 - b. At the Forgotten Username or Password screen, enter your email address on file
 - c. Then click the "submit" button
 - d. An email will be sent to you with a web link to a HAC challenge question
 - After you answer the challenge questions correctly, you will be able to view your Username or reset your password. (You cannot change your Username once set)

News from the Clinic

BOOSTING your Little One's Immune System during Cold & Flu Season

With Cold & Flu Season upon us, I wanted to and give you some tips from the clinic on boosting your little one's immune system.

- Hand washing is the simplest and one of the most effective ways to keep from getting colds or giving them to others.
- Good Nutrition: There is a huge correlation between adequate nutrition, immune balance and resistance to infection.
 - Vitamin deficiencies = decreased immunity
 - Food sensitivities and allergies = compromised intestinal barrier = decreased immunity
 - Processed foods, chemicals in foods, irritate and cause inflammation in the intestines = decreased immunity
 - Limit refined sugars. Sugar can suppress your immune system and impair your defenses against infectious disease. 1 teaspoon of sugar suppresses your child's immune function by 50% for 24-48 hours.
 - Avoid food additives, colorings, MSG, ingredients you can't pronounce: Tartrazine, benzoic acid, carmolic acid, sulfur dioxide, caramel colour, sodium nitrate, BHT, BHA, Red 2G, blue dyes, all yellow dyes.
- Ensure adequate elimination: drink lots of water, make sure your child is having regular bowel movements and good digestion to help the body metabolize and eliminate unwanted toxins and pathogens

Have You Had "The Talk" With Your Child?

No, not THAT talk. But it's a very important "talk" that needs to be had with your technology using children...

In school we hear about children searching YouTube on a daily basis. As you may or may not know there are many inappropriate videos on YouTube. When searching a seemingly innocent topic, children may come across something not so innocent. There are some not-so-nice people who name videos with innocent sounding names to get people to look at their videos.

Of course that also happens when children are searching the Internet to find out about school topics or other topics of interest. Unfortunately there are more of those not-sonice people that again title their articles with innocent sounding names in hopes of luring in children, and unsuspecting adults.

So what should we do about it? Experts advise keeping the computer in a public place in the home so that an adult is always around to supervise activity on the computer. We also need to teach our children to notify us immediately if they do accidentally access an inappropriate site so that we can contact our Internet service provider in hopes that they'll remove the link.

Common Sense Media provides excellent suggestions for these and many other topics that will provide you with important information in helping keep our children safe as they navigate the technology superhighways.

Kindergarten Team and Comfort for Canines



This year our Kindergarten classes at Wards Creek have begun a community service project to help our local animal shelters and we need your help!

How you can help:

Clean out your closet and throw in the towel! The shelters are in need of these items:

Blankets, towels, fleece throws, pet beds, and baby blankets.

Think soft, absorbent, and not too bulky... things you'd wash at home. Items that can cushion the bottoms of crates and kennels, and keep dogs' noses, paws and ears dry.

Items that are not so good to donate:

- For the most part, shelters do not want bed sheets—they are not absorbent enough and do not stand up to repeated laundering. Anything too bulky is difficult for the shelter staffs to manage; this precludes comforters, bedspreads, heavy area rugs, queen or king-sized quilts and mattress covers.
- No pillows at all.
- No electric blankets, please, unless the cords are removed.
- No clothes, please!

Feel free to start sending in these items now. You can either send it in with your child, leave it at the front desk, or walk it in to your child's classroom. Thank you so much for your help and support. Look for an update soon after our first drop off to the shelters!

WCES First Annual 5th Grade "From the , to the " Book Swap


Fifth grade will be collecting used books from now until February for our book swap.


