Note from our ILC

Dear Families of Wards Creek Elementary,

This month I'll be sharing information with you about standard six from The Florida Standards and the Common Core Anchor Standards for Reading. The Anchor Standards for Reading are the standards that guide Kindergarten through 12th grade students to become college and career ready. Anchor Standard Six Reads:

Assess how point of view or purpose shapes the content and style of a text.

This standard is asking students to consider two important aspects of a piece of literature. First, the readers must be able to identify the point of the view of the characters in the text and the purpose the piece was written. Secondly, students are asked to take their knowledge of the point of view and purpose to assess how this point of view or purpose is connected to the content of the text, as well as the style it was written.

Take, for example, the book <u>Bud</u>, <u>Not Buddy</u> by Christopher Paul Curtis. This text is a read-aloud text exemplar for second and third grade, and an independent read for grades four and five. <u>Bud</u>, <u>Not Buddy</u> takes place in the 1930s and is told in the first person by a ten year old boy who is was orphaned and runs away. When reading this text, we would want students to consider how the first person narrative of a ten-year-old boy is related to the content and style of the writing. In the book, the language Bud uses reflects both his age and the area that book takes place. Additionally, the style of the writing also reflects the attitude of Bud and the era of the Great Depression.

Other great books to use for students to explore point of view are <u>Voices in the Park</u> by Anthony Browne, <u>Wonder</u> by R.J. Palacio, and <u>Ungifted</u> by Gordan Korman. Each of these books tells a story from different characters' points of view.

These standards are rigorous and require our students to be critical readers and thinkers. Continue reading with your child and ask them to talk about what they are reading!
