The results are in! The Nemours

BrightStart! pilot program was a great success. We will be continuing the current program and piloting an expansion into kindergarten at The Webster School. The students showed gains across the board. At Crookshank and Southwoods elementary schools, 16 students were in the traditional BrightStart! Program, with 23 students in the Brightstart! Intervention Program. Those in the intervention program gained 9.57 points while those with no intervention gained 4.69 points. At Southwoods Elementary and The Webster School, 28 students were in pull out intervention groups and 31 were in the non-intervention groups. They realized a gain of 7.82 points and 1.74 points respectively.

Over 75 lead teachers and department heads were able to utilize the Bailey Resource Group Depot during an open house in August. Over 1,000 inventoried items and many unique materials were selected for immediate use. The updated system has received over 100 orders since the open house. 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Inscribed Brick Program



Augustine's Visitor Information Center is the entry point for most who come to the historic ancient city. Next to the stately building, beneath a canopy of trees and beside the 200-year old Huegonot Cemetery, is a picturesque brick patio surrounding the huge coquina ball that represents the eastern terminus of the trans-America Old Spanish Trail. The patio's inscribed brick project offers a

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rare opportunity to leave your memory within the historic city during its 450th anniversary and beyond. When you buy a personalized brick, your name or the name of a loved one or a message will become a permanent part of the memorial patio. The profits from the sale of the bricks help to pay for historic preservation projects within the colonial city.
