Guidance Corner

With the 2014-2015 school year in full swing, I wanted to provide Wards Creek Families with several guidance updates. I would also like to welcome Mrs. Kimberly Peterson to the Guidance Department! Mrs. Peterson has taken on the role as a Guidance Para and is a huge asset to the program.

This year brings research based programs to the students at Wards Creek. The Second Step program helps students learn about the concepts of empathy, anxiety, emotionmanagement, and problem-solving skills and how to put these concepts into action. Each grade level has a lesson from the program during WOW Wednesdays. The program was launched with WCES's 4th and 5th Graders, where students were presented with a lesson on Gossip. The 3rd graders learned how to identify feelings. WOW did they come up with an amazing amount of "feeling" words! On WOW Wednesdays, please remember to ask your Warrior about their guidance lesson.

Social Skills Groups and Lunch Bunches have also been implemented at Wards Creek. Several Curriculums are used, which include the "Owning Up" program and "Skillstreaming". The goal of these programs is to help student's develop and fine tune their Social Skills. Finally, WCES is pleased to have "HeartMath" installed in the Guidance Small Group Classroom. This program uses biofeedback (finger sensor) to help students learn to connect their hearts and minds in order to breathe correctly and use self-calming techniques.

Dear Families of Wards Creek Elementary,

Welcome back! I hope everyone is enjoying the start to the 2014-2015 school year. This year I will continue sharing information about each of the Florida Standards, Anchor Standards for Reading. These are the standards that guide Kindergarten through 12th grade students in becoming college and career ready. Last year I shared standard one-six. This month we will examine standard seven of The Florida Standards for Reading. Anchor Standard Seven Reads:

Integrate and evaluate content presented in diverse media and formats, including visually and quantitatively, as well as in words.

This standard starts in kindergarten with students describing the relationship between illustrations and the story in which they appear and continues to progress throughout the grades. For example, third grade students are asked to explain how specific aspects of a text's illustrations contribute to what is conveyed by the words in a story (e.g., create mood, emphasize aspects of a character or setting) and then by fifth grade students are asked to analyze how visual and multimedia elements contribute to the meaning, tone, or beauty of a text (e.g., graphic novel, multimedia presentation of fiction, folktale, myth, poem). This same standard continues to develop in middle and high school.

To support your child in achieving this standard, consider asking your child the following questions about what they are reading:

- How does this illustration connect with the text?
- Why do you think the illustrator include this particular illustration?
- How does this visual contribute to the tone of the text?

These standards are rigorous and require our students to be critical readers and thinkers. Continue reading with your child and ask them to talk about what they are reading!

This is a reminder that after school enrichment activities are accepting registrations for their programs. It's not too late to sign your child up for these activities. News from the Nurse

To Parents, Teachers and Staff at Wards Creek Elementary:

You may have heard the media reports about a multistate outbreak of a virus called "enterovirus D68" (or "EV-D68"), which is sending some children to the hospital with respiratory illness. Although there have been no confirmed cases of EV-D68 at the local hospitals and pediatricians, they are reporting seeing an increase in illnesses that may be consistent with this virus and they are monitoring the activity very closely. Given that all types of enterovirus are contagious, we need to be diligent and preemptive, especially with hand washing and proper infection control techniques.

What is enterovirus D68?

- An enterovirus is a common virus there are more than 100 types of enteroviruses.
- •EV-D68 is a less common type of enterovirus which causes respiratory illness. Laboratory testing should be considered if the presentation is unclear and the severity is worsening. Testing is being done, very selectively, by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).
- Babies, children and adolescents are more likely to be infected and become sick.

What are the symptoms?

- EV-D68 causes mild to severe respiratory illness and could exacerbate asthma.
- The full spectrum of EV-D68 disease is not known.

How is it transmitted?

• Like other enteroviruses, EV-D68 seems to spread through close contact with infected people.

How is it treated?

- There is no specific treatment for EV-D68 infection other than supportive care.
- •Some patients with severe respiratory illness may need to be hospitalized.

Is EV-D68 new?

• No, EV-D68 was first reported in 1962 in California. Rare clusters have been reported since then.

What can be done to reduce the risk of infection?

- Wash hands often. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth.
- Avoid sharing cups or eating utensils with people who are sick.
- Disinfect frequently touched surfaces (e.g., toys and doorknobs).
- •Stay home and see your health care provider if you are ill.
- •Children who experience difficulty breathing with cold symptoms should be evaluated by a health care provider.

At Wards Creek, we are vigilant in our cleanliness, as well as making sure that children are washing their hands often. Please make sure you are carrying this through at home as well. If your student is exhibiting any signs and symptoms listed above, please take them to their pediatrician for a professional evaluation. 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
