SUMMER MARINE SCIENCE PROGRAM

Parents,

Applications for the summer Marine Science Program were passed out at all schools during the week of February 16th. Applications were due back to science teachers by February 27th. Applications can still be downloaded at any time from the website prior to April 15 at <u>http://www-grms.stjohns.k12.fl.us/</u> and click on the Marine Science link. The link also will have a complete day by day curriculum for each grade level, parent information, and a video from last year's program.

This summer program is available to all students currently in grades five through seven and has been sponsored by the school district since 1982. Three eight day sessions are held at Gamble Rogers Middle School with bus transportation provided. The dates for the three sessions this summer will be June 8th through June 18th, June 22nd through July 2nd, and July 6th through July 16th. Small classes of 12-14 students are separated by grade level. All instructors in the program are St. Johns County School District teachers.

The Marine Science Program is a carefully designed experience for responsible students who are interested in learning about our local marine environments. Learning is "hands on" in the field with students kayaking, canoeing, boating, hiking, snorkeling, sailing, windsurfing, surfing, SUP, (stand up paddleboarding), etc. Specific grade level activities and curriculum are attached to the applications and are also available from the website.

Calling all Ward's Creek Parents, Grandparents, and Community Members: We need your help! Testing is right around the corner for KG to 5th Graders and Wards Creek Elementary is in need of Proctors. Proctors are "another set of eyes" during each testing session, making sure that students are in the right place and following the teacher's directions. They will not be administering the test.

Testing will take place March 5 – May 21. District policy states that we have a proctor in each testing room. Proctors for testing can be anyone who is willing to volunteer, and who has been approved through the district to volunteer at Wards Creek Elementary. To sign up to volunteer at Wards Creek Elementary School, you may visit the school's homepage and under "Quick Links" click on "School Access Form." The volunteer application is easy to fill out and is usually approved within two weeks of submission.

Dear Families of Wards Creek Elementary,

Many times parents ask what they can do at home with their child, and the resounding answer is "read with your child." So what does that mean, and how can you make that time meaningful?

In her book Reading in the Wild, author Donalyn Miller writes about how to instill lifelong reading behaviors in children. She says, "Children who love reading and see themselves as readers are the most successful in school and have the greatest opportunities in life" (p. xix). To create children who love reading, Donalyn outlines five important reading behaviors.

- Readers dedicate time to read. Does your child willingly spend time reading daily? Consider reading in front of your child to model good reading behaviors.
- Readers self-select reading materials. Can your child select books that meet their interests, needs, and reading abilities? Consider asking your child questions about how he or she selects books to read?
- Readers share books and reading with other readers. Does your child tell you about books they are reading? Consider asking your child about the books they're reading.
- Readers have reading plans. Does your child have the next book they want to read already chosen? Consider helping your child use the site <u>www.goodreads.com</u> or <u>www.amazon.com</u> to assist your child in finding other books by favorite authors, or books similar to their preferred genres or topics.
- Readers show preferences for genres, authors, and topics. Can your child articulate reading preferences? Consider challenging your student to expand their reading by connecting their current interests with similar genres, authors, or topics.

Building a strong and happy reading life is one that takes time and effort, but will pay off greatly for students. As always, please don't hesitate to contact me with any questions!

"Comfort for Canines"





This year our Kindergarten classes at Wards Creek have begun a community service project to help our local animal shelters and we need your help!

<u>How you can help:</u>

Clean out your closet and throw in the towel! The shelters are in need of these items: *Blankets, towels, fleece throws, pet beds, and baby blankets*.

Think soft, absorbent, and not too bulky... things you'd wash at home. Items that can cushion the bottoms of crates and kennels, and keep dogs' noses, paws and ears dry.



Items that are not so good to donate:

- For the most part, shelters do not want bed sheets they are not absorbent enough and do not stand up to repeated laundering.
 Anything too bulky is difficult for the shelter staffs to manage; this precludes comforters, bedspreads, heavy area rugs, queen or king-sized quilts and mattress covers.
 - No pillows at all.
 - *No electric blankets, please, unless the cords are removed.*
 - *No clothes, please!*

Feel free to start sending in these items now. You can either send it in with your child, leave it at the front desk, or walk it in to your child's classroom. Thank you so much for your help and support. Look for an update soon after our first drop off to the shelters!



We hope that this letter finds you and your child(ren) enjoying a successful school year. The purpose of this letter is to provide updated and new information regarding the Hardship Out of Zone Waiver process. If you already have at least one child on an approved 2014-15 Out of Zone Hardship Transfer waiver, or, if you feel you have a hardship that would prevent your child from achieving success at their zoned school, the following process applies.

If you have a child on an approved 2014-15 Out of Zone Hardship, this waiver will expire at the end of this school year. At that time, your child will be reassigned to your zoned school for the 2015-16 school year. If you would like your child to remain at the out of zone school he/she is currently attending, you <u>must apply for an Out of Zone</u> <u>Hardship waiver again</u>. The request may only be approved if your reason meets the criteria for a hardship. Rising eleventh and twelfth grade students in Aberdeen who are already enrolled at Creekside High, may again remain, if they submit an Out of Zone Hardship Transfer Application.

A student may be granted an Out of Zone Hardship transfer when a condition or situation exists that implies an adverse or compelling circumstance, or a state of misfortune unique to that student's life or a family's life situation. In this case, you must complete a Hardship Out of Zone Application, and submit it for approval to the Office for School Services.

The transfer request process will begin on **February 13, 2015**. You will have until **April 30, 2015** to submit your request. The sooner your application is received, the sooner your child's class schedule for next school year may be completed. If applicable to your reason for request, please be sure to mention that you are applying for the "grandfathered" condition for your fifth, eighth, or twelfth grade child when completing the Out of Zone Application. Your prompt attention to submitting an application will assist your school in preparing to meet requirements for state and federal funding, class size compliance, and other governmental and administrative applications. The applications and the directions for the process can be found on our district website at: http://www.stjohns.k12.fl.us/depts/os/schoolserv/transfers. Additionally, please note that transportation will not be provided to students who receive an approved out of zone waiver.

A paper version can be sent home with your child if requested. Please request this form from your current school office. Should you decide to apply for a Hardship Out of Zone waiver, you will receive an electronic reply sent to the email address you provide on the application, within approximately three weeks from the date we receive your request. If an email address is not available, we will mail you a copy of the decision.

We look forward to working with you to address your needs. If you have any questions regarding the out of zone hardship transfer process, please do not hesitate to contact my office at 904.547.7583.
