Skills Your Child Should Know Before Coming To Kindergarten

Children don't need to be able to read by the time they enter kindergarten, instead students should be ready to be taught how to read.

Parents should read, sing, and talk with their child daily to prepare them.

Here are some examples of what children should be able to do:

- *Recognize alphabet letters. This means recognizing isolated letters, not just memorizing them in sequence.
- *Know their first and last name. Be able to recognize name in print.
- *Count, typically students should be able to reach at least 20, and they need to understand the concept that each number corresponds to a quantity.
- *Recognize numbers and patterns. This includes being able to distinguish between letters and numbers.
- *Identify shapes and colors. Can sort and classify by shape, size, and color.
- *Share, wait their turn, and communicate with words, not actions when they are upset.
- *Pay attention: students should be able to sit long enough to hear a story and be able to understand and follow two-step and three-step directions.
- *Zip, snap, tie, button, and fasten Velcro. They should be able to tie their own shoes and take care of their bathroom needs independently.
- *Cut and glue independently.
- *They should be practicing their phone number and address.
- *Please see the additional handout with SOME of the high frequency words your child will learn in kindergarten.

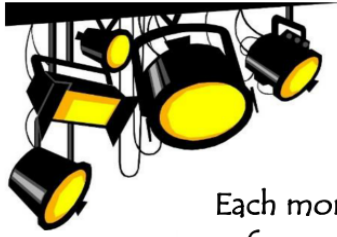

Wards Creek Elementary Home Access Center (HAC) Account Registration Instructions



Accessing Home Access Center (HAC) for the first time (applies to new users and existing Parent Assistant (PA) users):

1. **If you have a current PA account**, you can use the same Username and Password to login to HAC. Enter your Username and Password at the new HAC website:

2. **How to get a Home Access Center account (for new users who do not have a Parent Assistant (PA) account):**
 - a. Parents/Guardians can then register online:
 - i. <http://parents.stjohns.k12.fl.us/hac>
 - ii. At the Home Access Center Login screen, click "here" below the statement, "If you do not have a username and password...."
 - iii. At the Home Access Center User Registration:
 1. Enter your First name, Last name, City and Zip Code as it appears in eSchoolPlus
 - a. Standard City spellings include: Saint Augustine, East Palatka, Ponte Vedra, Ponte Vedra Beach, Elkton, Jacksonville, Saint Johns, Hastings and Fruit Cove
 2. Then click the Register button
 3. (next screen) Then create your Username (using your email address)
 4. Then create two challenge questions (something detailed only you would know) (Example: What was your first car?)
 5. Review and accept the Terms of Use and Privacy Policy
 6. Click the Finish button
 - iv. Click the link in your HAC email to create your HAC password
 - v. A webpage will load with your challenge questions. After you answer your challenge questions, you will then be able to create your password, (please use at least eight characters including a number or special character)
 - vi. You can now login to HAC using your new Username and Password
3. **If you have forgotten your Password:**
 - a. On the login screen, click the "forgot my username or password" link
 - b. At the Forgotten Username or Password screen, enter your email address on file
 - c. Then click the "submit" button
 - d. An email will be sent to you with a web link to a HAC challenge question
 - e. After you answer the challenge questions correctly, you will be able to view your Username or reset your password. (You cannot change your Username once set)

Fantastic Fourth Grade!

The fourth grade students are busily preparing for the FSA Writing Assessment that will take place in less than seven weeks. Here are five things parents should know about the FSA Writing Assessment:

1. Students will be asked to read 2-3 articles up to 1300 words. They will use information from the articles to form the basis for their writing.
2. Students will be given an Opinion or Informational Prompt to write to.
3. Students will then plan their writing for a five paragraph essay.
4. Students will have 90 minutes for Reading, Planning, and Writing (write and edit). Students will have an option to use an additional 30 minutes.
5. Students will write this essay in one setting with FSA specific paper.

How can you help your child with writing?

1. Write.
2. Write thank you notes, letters, shopping lists, poems, or captions to family photos.
3. Use other content sources (science, math, social studies text) as writing resources. For example, during math homework have your child write one sentence explaining what he or she is solving. They can also write to explain how they solved the problem.
4. Summarization is one of the most difficult tasks; provide relevant practice.
5. Write.

Kindergarten Team and Comfort for Canines



This year our Kindergarten classes at Wards Creek have begun a community service project to help our local animal shelters and we need your help!

How you can help:

Clean out your closet and throw in the towel! The shelters are in need of these items:

Blankets, towels, fleece throws, pet beds, and baby blankets.

Think soft, absorbent, and not too bulky... things you'd wash at home. Items that can cushion the bottoms of crates and kennels, and keep dogs' noses, paws and ears dry.

Items that are not so good to donate:

- *For the most part, shelters do not want bed sheets—they are not absorbent enough and do not stand up to repeated laundering. Anything too bulky is difficult for the shelter staffs to manage; this precludes comforters, bedspreads, heavy area rugs, queen or king-sized quilts and mattress covers.*
- *No pillows at all.*
- *No electric blankets, please, unless the cords are removed.*
- *No clothes, please!*

Feel free to start sending in these items now. You can either send it in with your child, leave it at the front desk, or walk it in to your child's classroom. Thank you so much for your help and support. Look for an update soon after our first drop off to the shelters!

Join us on Saturday, February 20th from 10am-Noon at Wadsworth Elementary/Buddy Taylor Middle School Cafeteria at the 2nd Annual Flagship Showcase. UF Jacksonville, Center for Autism and Related Disabilities (CARD) has partnered with the Exceptional Student Education Department of Flagler County Schools to present two workshops for our parents:

Workshop #1: CARD 101 presented by Carrie Fagen, Clinician, MED. This workshop is an overview of services offered through the UF-Jacksonville Center for Autism and Related Disabilities. Carrie will review the criteria for enrolling in CARD and the types of services offered to families, schools and communities. She will also discuss the consultative appointments, trainings and events offered through CARD. This workshop will be housed in Room 9-121 from 10am-11am.

Workshop #2: AUTISM AND BEHAVIOR presented by Katrina Ressa, Clinician, BCABA. This training will review the basic components of Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA). Katrina will discuss how ABA techniques can be used to address some of the common behaviors associated with Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD). Parents will learn about the basic functions of behavior, reinforcement and visual supports. This workshop will be housed in Room 9-121 from 11:00am-Noon.

SUMMER MARINE SCIENCE PROGRAM

Parents,

Applications for the summer Marine Science Program will be passed out by science teachers at all schools during the week of February 16th. Applications will be due back to science teachers by March 4th. Applications can also be downloaded at any time from the website prior to April 15 at <http://www-grms.stjohns.k12.fl.us/> and click on the Marine Science link. The link also will have a complete day by day curriculum for each grade level, parent information, and a video from last year's program.

This summer program is available to all students currently in grades five through seven and has been sponsored by the school district since 1982. Three eight day sessions are held at Gamble Rogers Middle School with bus transportation provided. The dates for the three sessions this summer will be May 31st through June 9th, June 13th through June 23rd, and June 27th through July 8th. Small classes of 12-14 students are separated by grade level. All instructors in the program are St. Johns County School District teachers.

The Marine Science Program is a carefully designed experience for responsible students who are interested in learning about our local marine environments. Learning is "hands on" in the field with students kayaking, canoeing, boating, hiking, snorkeling, sailing, windsurfing, surfing, SUP, (stand up paddleboarding), etc. Specific grade level activities and curriculum are attached to the applications and are also available from the website.
