## Skills Your Child Should Know Before Coming To Kindergarten

Children don't need to be able to read by the time they enter kindergarten, instead students should be ready to be taught how to read. Parents should read, sing, and talk with their child daily to prepare them.

Here are some examples of what children should be able to do:

- \*Recognize alphabet letters. This means recognizing isolated letters, not just memorizing them in sequence.
- \*Know their first and last name. Be able to recognize name in print.
- \*Count, typically students should be able to reach at least 20, and they need to understand the concept that each number corresponds to a quantity.
- \*Recognize numbers and patterns. This includes being able to distinguish between letters and numbers.
- \*Identify shapes and colors. Can sort and classify by shape, size, and color.
- \*Share, wait their turn, and communicate with words, not actions when they are upset.
- \*Pay attention: students should be able to sit long enough to hear a story and be able to understand and follow two-step and three-step directions.
- \*Zip, snap, tie, button, and fasten Velcro. They should be able to tie their own shoes and take care of their bathroom needs independently.
- \*Cut and glue independently.
- \*They should be practicing their phone number and address.
- \*Please see the additional handout with *SOME* of the high frequency words your child will learn in kindergarten.

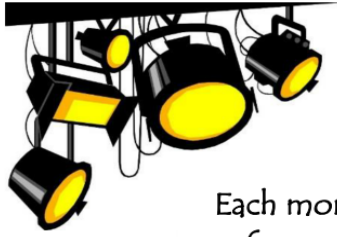

### **Extended Day 2016/17:**

**Extended Day Early Registration for 2016-17 will open on March 1, 2016.**

We will be accepting early registration for the extended day program for 2016-17 school year starting March 1<sup>st</sup> through May 26<sup>th</sup>. The benefits of registering early is you will receive a \$25 discount and it will hold your child's slot in our program. The amount to register is \$50.00 if registered on or before the last day of school. Registration will open again on August 3<sup>rd</sup> 2016. The registration on August 3<sup>rd</sup> will be \$75.00. Please note that there will be two monthly payments due in August. The first monthly payment will be due on August 3<sup>rd</sup> and the second monthly payment will be due on August 15<sup>th</sup>. (See page 11 for the payment calendar!)

# Schedule of Fees

Extended Day

In an effort to help clarify our fee schedule; below is a detailed explanation of our payment procedures.

The school calendar year consists of 180 days that the children are in attendance. Each month varies from another in the amount of days attended. Due to the variance, we have broken up the extended day fees into 10 equal payments for your convenience. Each payment covers 18 days of child care.

Florida state law requires that all services must be paid in full prior to services being rendered.

Due to state law and regulation payments are due on the 15th of the month (exp-August before we are in attendance). All payments past due by 5 days will be rendered a \$5.00 late fee and \$5.00 fee per every 5 days late after that. If balance is unpaid by the date in the "Covers Your Childs Care Through:" box below, your child will be unable to attend Extended Day until balance is paid in full.

## Wards Creek Elementary Home Access Center (HAC) Account Registration Instructions



Accessing Home Access Center (HAC) for the first time (applies to new users and existing Parent Assistant (PA) users):

1. **If you have a current PA account**, you can use the same Username and Password to login to HAC. Enter your Username and Password at the new HAC website:

2. **How to get a Home Access Center account (for new users who do not have a Parent Assistant (PA) account):**
  - a. Parents/Guardians can then register online:
    - i. <http://parents.stjohns.k12.fl.us/hac>
    - ii. At the Home Access Center Login screen, click "here" below the statement, "If you do not have a username and password...."
    - iii. At the Home Access Center User Registration:
      1. Enter your First name, Last name, City and Zip Code as it appears in eSchoolPlus
        - a. Standard City spellings include: Saint Augustine, East Palatka, Ponte Vedra, Ponte Vedra Beach, Elkton, Jacksonville, Saint Johns, Hastings and Fruit Cove
      2. Then click the Register button
      3. (next screen) Then create your Username (using your email address)
      4. Then create two challenge questions (something detailed only you would know) (Example: What was your first car?)
      5. Review and accept the Terms of Use and Privacy Policy
      6. Click the Finish button
    - iv. Click the link in your HAC email to create your HAC password
    - v. A webpage will load with your challenge questions. After you answer your challenge questions, you will then be able to create your password, (please use at least eight characters including a number or special character)
    - vi. You can now login to HAC using your new Username and Password
3. **If you have forgotten your Password:**
  - a. On the login screen, click the "forgot my username or password" link
  - b. At the Forgotten Username or Password screen, enter your email address on file
  - c. Then click the "submit" button
  - d. An email will be sent to you with a web link to a HAC challenge question
  - e. After you answer the challenge questions correctly, you will be able to view your Username or reset your password. (You cannot change your Username once set)
