The Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) is a progress monitoring system that is administered three times per year to track your student's progress in learning the Benchmarks of Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) Standards throughout this school year. The purpose of this letter is to inform you that your student will take the Grade 2 Renaissance Star Reading assessment on Thursday, December 4<sup>th</sup> and Star Math assessment Thursday, December 11th. Your student's results from PM2 provide mid-year information on student progress, and you will be provided with information about how to access the results after testing is completed. Students who earn a scale score of 852 or higher on Star Literacy are considered "probable readers."

FAST assessments are computer-adaptive tests taken on a computer or tablet. The questions get easier or more difficult depending on how the student responds, and each student will see different questions. If you or your student would like to review Star Reading, and/or Star Math sample items at home, visit <a href="https://flfast.org/families.html">https://flfast.org/families.html</a>.

The Star Early Literacy assessment typically takes less than 15 minutes to complete. The Star Reading assessment is usually completed in less than 20 minutes, and the Star Math assessment is usually completed in less than 30 minutes to complete.
