


Warrior Highlights!




<u>Excellent ESE</u> Speech Practice at Home

Does your child receive speech services? One of the most important things they can do to increase their accuracy is to practice their target sounds at home. Here are some suggestions to help motivate your child to practice:

- Play a game-any game! Get out a board game and have your child say his/her words 5 times each time it is his/her turn.
- Blow bubbles. Each time your child says 10 words, they get to blow (or pop) some bubbles.
- Roll the dice. Have your child roll 1 die. Whatever number is rolled is the number of times your child says the word.
- Play hopscotch. Your child can say a word each time he or she jumps.
- LEGOs!! Give your child 1 Lego for each word that is produced. Then they can create anything they choose.
- Get out the basketball. Each time your child makes (or misses – your choice) a basket, he/she needs to produce a word 3-5 times.
- Read, read, read. Have your child read ANYTHING out loud. Maybe they would like to read you a page of their favorite book, descriptions of meals at a restaurant, or Sunday comics. Remind them to take their time and read slowly.

These are just a few suggestions that you can use to work with your child at home. There are tons of other activities; be creative and HAVE FUN!



<u>Terrific Third Grade</u>

Third Grade had an exciting time enjoying their end of the year field trip to Sweet Pete's! When the students arrived they were greeted by their own candy factory guides and taken to the 3rd floor where they participated in a candy making experience. The candy maker explained the process, discussed ingredients, temperature, and tools. The students gained an understanding of the importance of temperature in candy making, making observations about various types of candies, and all the ingredients used to create milk/white chocolate. The instructors asked the children questions, demonstrated, and allowed them to take part in the candy making and designing/creating of their own labels. The students were excited to leave this part of the field trip with their own chocolate bars! Students then made their way into another room where additional instructors lead them in candy experiments. Afterwards, they had the pleasure of viewing the candy making process "in action" from a private balcony overlooking the kitchen where they learned more interesting facts about chocolate. The students learned the history of chocolate, incorporated our science standards, and most importantly had fun while learning!



News from the PE Hut!



Leadership Roles at Home

Each new school year brings opportunities for academic growth and growth in all areas of development. Although children must be knowledgeable when they graduate, they must also be healthy, engaged, responsible, and caring people.

One of the best ways to help your child realize his or her worth and leadership potential is to provide an opportunity to lead. Most Leader in Me Schools offer student leadership roles as a way to teach: Responsibility. Leadership. Contribution.

Leadership roles can also be used at home. To begin:

- 1. Talk with your child about the leadership role he or she might be interested in at home.
- 2. Discuss why he or she is interested in the role. Ask what leadership qualities your child has that will help. Ask how he or she will handle homework or other commitments with this newrole responsibility.
- 3. Together, discuss, write, and sign the paper detailing the leadership behavior and expectations of the role.
- 4. Give your child a week or so to adjust and then discuss how it's going. This may open a conversation on how to handle things that are too easy or too difficult.
- 5. Express appreciation and celebrate success!

Two missed days a month adds up to being a half a year behind by the time your child reaches 4th grade. And once a child falls behind, they rarely catch up.

It is important that your child arrive at school between 8:00 am and 8:25 am. Please make sure your child arrives at school by 8:25 am so that they can be in their classroom ready to learn by 8:30 am. If you child is absent please send a note or email within 48 hours of returning to school. **Research shows that attendance is an important factor in student achievement.*



Help Your Child Succeed in School: Build the Habit of Good Attendance Early School success goes hand in hand with good attendance!

DID YOU KNOW?

- Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks.
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Good attendance will help children do well in high school, college, and at work.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- Set a regular bed time and morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Find out what day school starts and make sure your child has the required shots.
- Introduce your child to her teachers and classmates before school starts to help her transition.
- Don't let your child stay home unless she is truly sick. Keep in mind complaints of a stomach ache or headache can be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors, or other parents for advice on how to make her feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor, or another parent.
- Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session.
