It means that when a child scores below 70% on a Summative (unit) test, they are given an opportunity to retest. Our philosophy is that if students do not do well on a particular assessment, we want to reteach the content so that students master the content before moving on. Sometimes, if teachers notice the whole class did not do well on a unit, they will give the class the opportunity to receive reteaching and retesting. We strive each day to help all children master the content we teach, in alignment with our mission statement of, "Achievement, Learning and Leadership for ALL."
