## MR. KLEIN



The saying, "Time flies when you are having fun," seems like this school year. It's hard to believe we are approaching the completion of the first quarter. The progress the students have made has been remarkable. They are practicing the Warrior Way, and I believe this will be the best year ever at WCE. I'm extremely thankful to the parents for helping us establish the routines and expectations and in your continued trust that we are doing everything possible for your child. And it's been enjoyable learning alongside our teachers during their Professional Learning Communities (PLC) meetings. They have been having great dialogue in charting the course for students' success in achievement, learning, and leadership.

October is the month I consider the most critical in ensuring academic growth and learning for all. Similar to establishing relationships and rituals and routines within the first few weeks of school, it is important to have critical conversations with parents for those students performing below expectations so we can strengthen the partnership between home and school. If we begin with the end in mind, the data we should start with is the FAST reading and math achievement levels, the end of the year standards.

If your child's score is below a level 3 after the first progress monitoring assessment, the teacher will be reaching out to you for a conference during this month. The goal would be to put in plan in place for a partnership in helping your child make tremendous strides prior to the 2nd and 3rd progress monitoring assessments.

It is important to note that the FAST achievement level does indicate success within all essential standards to be taught during this school year. So, a lower score than what you may have anticipated would likely be because your child does not have the background knowledge for that standard yet. In this case, the report card would help identify how your child is progressing with the material being taught in class. For K-2, you'll want to learn more about which benchmarks your child has received an "I" for Needs Improvement. In 3rd-5th grade you will want to know more about the essential standards your child is struggling with that may have resulted in your child receiving less than a "B" on the report card.


Within these conferences, the teacher will identify the gaps in your child's learning and the plan in place to bridge that gap. The teacher will be able to provide you with suggestions of how you can reinforce the learning process at home too.

If your child is "on target" with the FAST, please continue to encourage your child to become even more proficient by increasing their scale score. Although parent/teacher conferences are not required for students at expectation, your child's teacher should be able to share what enrichment activities are taking place in the classroom to increase the rigor your child would need to continue to show growth in their learning.

In a previous TORCH edition, I was able to share some information about incorporating higher order thinking skills at home through Bloom's Taxonomy question stems. I have shared those again, along with several other attachments that you may utilize in reinforcing learning opportunities.
